

The <u>Las Vegas Springs Preserve</u> is a 180-acre cultural and biological resource located just west of downtown, known historically as "Big Springs". A project to restore and revive this unique area is currently underway, organized by the <u>Las Vegas Valley Water District</u>. The Springs include a variety of museums, gardens, hiking trails and restored structures for use and enjoyment by the public. The cultural, environmental and historical exhibits at the Springs showcase the rich history of the region, highlighting the profiles of the different settler groups that inhabited the land over the years.

Adjacent to the Las Vegas Valley Water District, and set just a few miles west of the Strip, the new Springs Preserve offers Vegas a park oasis in the middle of the city.

Likened to New York's Central Park, Vegas' version is a 180-acre park with hiking trails, gardens, children's activities, and the Springs Café, run by celebrity chef Wolfgang Puck's restaurant group. The park also offers two museums: the Origen Experience, which teaches the natural and cultural history of the preserve among three galleries; and the Desert Living Center, which offers exhibits on preserving the environment and living in a desert climate.

Practicing what they preach, the parking lot features solar-paneled carports that not only provide shade for 200 spaces, but also generate electricity for use by the complex. The park plans uses collected reinvector to help irrigate gardens and it uses

tricity for use by the complex. The park plans uses collected rainwater to help irrigate gardens and it uses bio-filtration ponds to reclaim wastewater on the site, which then also are reused to irrigate, as well as flush toilets.



The Springs Preserve is located at 333 S. Valley View Blvd., just south of I-95 and about 5-10 minutes west of the Strip. It is open daily from 10am to 10pm, though hiking trails will close at dusk. For more information, visit www.springspreserve.org or call 702.822.8344.

A Brief History of GITA...

Back in the late 1960s, a group from Public Service Company of Colorado were among the first to develop an automated mapping/facilities management system. It was revolutionary for its time and provided significant advantages in efficiency and cost-effectiveness for the company. People saw the technology's potential, and in 1978, decided to hold the first "Keystone Conference," which attracted 32 attendees. In 1982, a formal not-for-profit organization was chartered to serve this growing industry with an educational forum to exchange ideas and keep up with changing technologies. The association was named AM/FM International, reflecting a revolutionary new technology that was sweeping the utility industry.

AM/FM International provided vision and leadership in educating individuals interested in implementing AM/FM/GIS technology. In 1998, AM/FM International changed its name to the Geospatial Information & Technology Association (GITA) in order to better reflect the association's new focus. GITA's mission is to provide excellence in education and information exchange on the use and benefits of geospatial information and technology for worldwide infrastructure.

The industries that GITA serves are defined as infrastructure-based organizations that can benefit from the application of geospatial information technologies. GITA defines infrastructure as all fundamental services, activities, and operations that sustain our communities and way of life.

In 2007, GITA changed the name of its Annual Conference to the Geospatial Infrastructure Solutions Conference to better reflect the rapidly expanding nature of the geospatial industry and the elevated knowledge and experience of its industry members. Read more about this recent change.


